

School and Pupil Census – Spring 2025

Census Checklist

Before Census Day:

-	Check you can log into COLLECT using DfE Sign-In	
	Check your entry in GIAS	
	Check the pupils' basic details	
	e.g.: name, date of birth, gender, enrolment status, year taught in, home address, eligibility for	
	free school meals, first language, ethnicity, and service child indicator.	
	Check that leavers and re-admissions have all been recorded correctly	
	Only those students on roll on census day should be included within your school's census return.	
	If your census return contains a child who is submitted on another school's return and is verified	
	as having attended there on census day, you will need to resubmit a corrected return later.	
	Check and correct student UPNs	
	If a student has attended a previous school, please obtain the UPN from that school. Temporary	
	UPNs should only be used as an interim measure and can flag up as an error on Duplicate UPN	
	reports.	
	Check Pupils Previously Looked-after Care Status	
	Check pupils previously looked-after care status where pupils have left care through adoption,	
	special guardianship order of child arrangements order. The October Census is vital for receiving	
	Pupil Premium plus funding attracted by previously looked after pupils in the following financial	
	year. The Virtual Schools Website (<u>The pupil premium and other funding - Schools</u>	
	(norfolk.gov.uk)) has more information regarding pupils previously in care.

Ď	Check free school meal eligibility information is fully recorded. For the 2025 Spring school census,

Before Census Day	completes the rollout of Universal Credit and from then until the point transitional protections

	FSM for children in households with no recourse to public funds (NRPF) - Previously the	
	guidance was to not record these children on the census as FSM eligible but to keep a separate	
	list. However, these children should now be recorded on the census in the same way as other	
	children who are eligible for free school meals.	
	School Lunches on Census Day	
	Ensure you have, or can be provided with, a list of all individual students in Reception, Year 1 and	
	Year 2 who will be eating a school lunch on census day. This would include all children eating a	
	school lunch irrespective of whether they take this under the universal infant free school meals	
	scheme or under free school meal deprivation criteria.	
	If a pupil is absent on census day, see which scenarios which qualify as an where you may need to	
	record this information in a different way so it doesn't affect your funding.	
	Early Years Funding:	
	If applicable to your school please check hours at Setting, Funded Hours for 2-, 3- and 4-year-olds,	
	Extended Childcare Hours, 30 Hour Code Indicator, Disability Access Fund, EYPP eligibility and	
	basis for funding and 2-year-old eligibility and basis for funding. Please ensure this is consistent	
	with information recorded on the Early Years Portal. If there is a difference, we may call you to	
	confirm what was correct on census day.	
	Exclusions/Suspensions Data	
	Check all suspensions and permanent exclusions with start dates between 01/04/2024 and	
	31/12/2024 are recorded.	

Please ensure that all appropriate exclusions are recorded as we will be reviewing submitted	
exclusions and will feedback where we believe there may be a mistake.	
Attendance Data	
Check attendance data. Deal with any missing marks and investigate any 'N' codes.	
Check pupils' enrolment status	
This is particularly important for those students who are dual registered. Most pupils will be	
recorded on the census as 'C Current – Sole Responsibility'. Dual Registered pupils should be	
recorded as 'M Dual Registered – main school' or 'S Dual Registered – subsidiary school'.	
Only one school should be recorded as main school.	
Check School Level information	
e.g.: establishment details, school email address, URN etc.	
Upload a file into COLLECT during the familiarisation period.	
This will enable you to check for any unexpected errors and queries that may not necessarily show	
up in your Management Information System (MIS). Please note this familiarisation period closes	
4pm on Friday 10 January 2025, and the Census will not show up when you log into COLLECT. The	
blade will return on Census day ready for you to upload and submit your return.	

From Census Day:

	Upload to COLLECT via DfE Sign-in	
Census Day	Once you have had your return approved by your Head/ Data manager then:	
	Login to COLLECT via the DfE Sign-in <u>https://services.signin.education.gov.uk/</u> and upload your xml file.	
	Check for Errors and Queries	
	Open your return and check for errors and queries within COLLECT. To clear errors, amendments	
	may need to be made within your MI system and a new file uploaded. Queries need checking and	
sua	either amending within COLLECT or by adding an appropriate note. Please see notepad guidance	
Ce	notes for acceptable wording.	
	Submit your file	
	Once you've cleared all errors and attached all notes to queries within COLLECT you can submit	
	your file. Please remember after clearing all errors and queries to press the 'Submit' button.	

After Census Day:

Run	Reports

After Census Day

Run all reports available on COLLECT. These will allow you to review and the data submitted and confirm it is correct. It will also clear the Reports Query. Reports should be run the day following submission and the query will clear the day following that.

Approval and Authorisation

If you are an LA Maintained School, NCC will check through your Census looking for additional errors. We may contact you if we have any questions regarding this. Once we are happy with your Census file, we will approve it and send it to the DfE to authorise. If there is a problem with the data, the DfE will not approve the file and we will be in touch.

Post Approval Checking

NCC will continue to run checks on the Census data and may still get in touch with you with queries even after the DfE have approved your file.
