Job role

The primary role of the TA is to support the class teacher to enhance pupils' learning, ensuring pupils understand the work set and know their learning objectives in order to make progress.

The role normally contains a variety of activities:

- Supporting learning activities
- Working as a team
- Safeguarding the welfare of children
- Supporting positive behaviour
- Planning class activities
- Promoting British values

Progression

Progression into the education sector, including HLTA, Assistant Teacher and Teacher.



Duration

The duration of the Level 3 Teaching Assistant Apprenticeship will typically be 15-18 months.

It is the responsibility of the employer to ensure every apprentice is given 20% of their paid hours as time to learn.



Qualification

Full Teaching Assistant Level 3.

You may be required to take Functional Skills maths and English at Level 2 if you do not already hold the equivalent GCSE grade 4-9 or (old system A*-C)
